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مُقَدِّمَةٌ

أصبحت اللغة الإنجليزية هي لغة التعامل الأولى في عالم اليوم، وكثير من الناس يجد أنه مضطر إلى تجاوز اختبار معين مثل اختبار توفل وغيره من الاختبارات القياسية الدولية في اللغة الإنجليزية بنجاح حتى يتمكن من التقدم للدراسة أو السفر والإقامة في دولة ما. ومن أجل ذلك أعددت هذا الكتاب الذي يركز على عنصرين مهمين جداً من عناصر اختبار التوفل وهما : قواعد اللغة وتراكيبها والمفردات.

فإذا تمكن الدارس من إجادة تطبيق قواعد لغة ما واستخدام قدر كبير من مفرداتها بكفاءة، سيصبح قادراً على القراءة بهذه اللغة بسهولة ومن ثم على فهم ما يقرأه. كما أنه يمكنه الاستماع إلى ما يقال بهذه اللغة وفهمه والإجابة عليه، بالإضافة إلى التحدث بها بنطق صحيح والكتابة بها دون أخطاء في الهجاء تسيء إليه عند من يقرأ ما كتبه. وهذا الكتاب يأمل أن يصل بالدارس إلى ذلك المستوى.

والكتاب كما هو واضح من عنوانه لا يحتوي إلا على تدريبات فقط، وهو يعتبر أداة مراجعة جيدة. حيث لا يستغرق استخدامه أكثر من عدة أسابيع قليلة. ويمكن للدارس أن يجيب على كل ما ورد فيه من تمارين قبل دخول الاختبار مباشرة. ولكن عليه أيضاً ألا يهمل الاستعداد لمكونات الاختبار الأخرى مثل الاستماع وقطع الفهم وكتابة المقال.

وباستطاعتك تنفيذ ذلك بالاستعانة بقاموس إنجليزي-عربي كبير مثل "قاموس أطلس الموسوعي". وتأكد بأنك أقدر الناس على تحديد ما تحتاج إليه من كلمات ومصطلحات إنجليزية جديدة، لأن لكل دارس مستواه الخاص به الذي لا يماثله فيه أحد تمام التماثل. بمعنى أن هناك دارس قد يعرف معاني قائمة طويلة جدا ومتنوعة من الكلمات الصعبة أو نادرة الاستخدام لكنه لا يعرف معنى كلمة بسيطة قد تكون شائعة الاستخدام في الكتب المدرسية في المرحلة الإعدادية. وبذلك فإن القوائم الخاصة بكل دارس مهمة جدا في رفع مستواه اللغوي لو اهتم بإعدادها.

ويجب أن تتوافر في تلك القوائم الشروط التالية :

- ١- أن تحتوي القائمة على معان متعددة لنفس الكلمة كما ترد بالقاموس لزيادة الاستفادة منها. كما أن ذلك يزيد من قدرات الدارس ومهاراته.
- ٢- أن يتأكد الدارس من حسن إعداد القائمة الخاصة به ومن صحة الهجاء والمعاني وأن يسجلها في دفتر خاص بها. ومن الأفضل طباعتها باستخدام الحاسب الآلي إذا كان ذلك متاحا. فالحاسب الآلي يمكن أيضا من مراجعة الهجاء أليا.
- ٣- أن يحسن الدارس الاستفادة من كل جديد يضيفه إلى القائمة ويحفظه ويستخدمه باستمرار.

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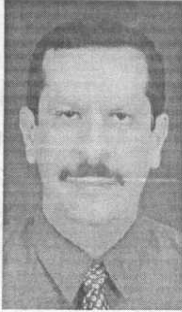
